We are actively monitoring the Covid pandemic that is spreading throughout our country. The worship committee and I are having several conversations about if we should suspend Sunday services and if/when we should plan to resume Wednesday services. As of right now, we will continue to monitor, discuss, and evaluate the situation to make what we feel is the best decision for the congregation. The second item I would like to bring you up to speed on is the search for a Pastor. We have had several leads and possibilities. So far, we haven't found the right fit. Discussions with Winthrop are just beginning, so we will see where this leads us. We received a couple interim candidates a month or so ago, but

they haven't been the right fit. We haven't received any new candidates for the last month. But, we are continuing to discuss, meet, and explore thoughts and options to find the right fit for our Church. I would like to thank Ray, and would encourage you to reach out to him, for doing a remarkable job filling in for the past Month. It's not an easy job and it takes lots of preparation and he is doing a tremendous service for us!

I would also like to thank Jake Connolly and his two committees, the SPRC and the Pulpit Committee. They have been working very hard the past month or two. Jake has done an amazing job communicating what is going on and is leading a very diligent group through this process. I would also like to thank the Worship committee for being available to decide on services. We hope to not have to suspend services again, but if it's necessary, we will make that decision. Last but not least, Parish Council... we met about every week for the month of May and first part of June. Thank you All!
